



PIEDRAS VIEJAS

Grown on steep Pre-Cordillera hillsides at 5200 feet of altitude, Piedras Viejas is the utmost agricultural challenge. It is one of the most extreme vineyards in the world. Small vineyard blocks of wildly different non alluvial soil types, like limestone ranging from 40 to 450 million years old, and broken basaltic rock. This geological diversity shows itself in distinctive flavors and aromas. First harvest was carried 7 years after planting.

Place of origin: Pre-Cordillera hillsides in El Challao, Las Heras, Mendoza.
