



## PIEDRAS VIEJAS TERRAZAS

Planted on the Pre-Cordillera slopes, due west of downtown Mendoza at an elevation of 5200 feet, Piedras Viejas is one of the most extreme vineyards in the world. This Piedras Viejas Terrazas wine is a bottling of two vineyard blocs whose soil is mostly Lutite, a black sedimentary rock, with intrusions of limestone. The Terrazas blocks started production 7 years after planting. Piedras Viejas is a new frontier in viticulture, that results in unique flavors and aromas.

Place of origin: Pre-Cordillera hillsides in El Challo, Las Heras, Mendoza.

Current vintages: 2017 and 2018.
